

Regulations for Use of Internet in Student Dormitories

Passed at the Administrative Council Meeting on March 18, 2002

Passed at the Administrative Council Meeting on September 21, 2009

Passed at the Administrative Council Meeting on May 31, 2010

The dormitories are equipped with internet access in order for students to freely discuss and exchange ideas on academic and technical affairs with domestic and international network users. Free of temporal and spatial limitations, students can develop sound international and global perspectives and well-rounded abilities. The following regulations are established so that by observing these rules, students can be responsible global citizens on the internet.

- Article 1 These regulations are established as the basis for management so students in the dormitories can fully enjoy the benefits of internet access.
- Article 2 Use of dormitory internet access should conform to the guidelines as set forth in related regulations such as Ming Chuan University Regulations for Campus Network Management.
- Article 3 For internet access in the dorms, students should have their own computers and network cables to ensure efficient transmission and access quality.
- Article 4 To protect internet users' rights and benefits and maintain proper operation of the internet server, any unapproved IP addresses are strictly prohibited.
- Article 5 Internet access was free of charge when it was first made available. Once the Ming Chuan University administration has decided on a rate for internet use, users will be required to pay the fee without any objection. The fee has to be paid before the due date.
- Article 6 In the case of any violation of the above regulations or any other inappropriate acts, students will be disciplined in proportion to the gravity of their offenses and in accordance with the Ming Chuan University Merit or Demerit Procedures.
- Article 7 Upon being passed at the Administrative Council Meeting and approved by the president, these regulations were announced and implemented. Any revision must follow the same procedure.
